Discussions: A Discussion Post is due at the end of the second week of each course for learners to share a reflection on learning. Just as it sounds, the purpose is for you to share with your course colleagues what you learned thus far from the course materials and how this learning connects to your own experience. You are encouraged to continue these conversations, sharing additional resources and experiences.

Exams: Each exam consists of 25 multiple-choice and true/false questions derived from the assigned readings and PowerPoint slides. The exams are "open book" with no time limit. There are no trick questions, but you do need to read each question thoughtfully to be successful. Find a time when you can devote at least 45 minutes of uninterrupted time to complete the exam. You will have three attempts to pass the exam (76% or higher). If you do not pass the exam on the first attempt, please take some time to review the course materials before retaking.

Applied Projects: Applied projects are work products that relate to course content and offer substantive application of course concepts. You will submit an applied project at the end of the first 5 courses. Complete instructions are included in the appropriate course. Each project will be reviewed by the course facilitator, providing feedback so that you can continue to improve the project before final submission during the final course. In the 6th course, you will submit a revised and complete project. Don't hesitate to ask questions of your course facilitator about strengthening your work throughout the program.
